

PATIENT TURNING

Implement repositioning reminder strategies to promote adherence to repositioning regimens
(Guideline Section 5.4)

Shown in a randomized controlled trial to reduce incidence of pressure injuries by **73%^{*4}** ↓

Implement an early mobilization program that increases activity and mobility as rapidly as tolerated
(Guideline Section 5.15)

Reposition patients such that optimal offloading of bony prominences and maximum redistribution of pressure is achieved
(Guideline Section 5.5)



LEAF^o Patient Monitoring System

One facility reported that the LEAF System helped save **\$71,500^{*40}** in one month, in non-reimbursable treatment costs. ↓

Initiate frequent small shifts in body position for critically ill individuals who are too unstable to maintain a regular repositioning schedule and to supplement regular repositioning
(Guideline Section 5.26)

SKIN PROTECTION

Use a soft silicone multi-layered foam dressing to protect the skin for individuals at risk of pressure injuries
(Guideline Section 3.5)

ALLEVYN GENTLE BORDER demonstrated a relative reduction in Stage I pressure injury incidence (p=0.006) of **90%^{*30}** ↓



ALLEVYN^o Foam Dressings

Use a prophylactic dressing as an adjunct to heel offloading and other strategies to prevent heel pressure injuries
(Guideline Section 6.4)

ALLEVYN LIFE was shown in one study to reduce sacral pressure injuries by **71%^{*7}** and in another study to reduce medical device-related pressure injuries from from 27% to **zero^{*21}** ↓



SECURA^o Skin Care

Use a prophylactic dressing beneath a medical device to reduce the risk of medical-related pressure injuries
(Guideline Section 8.5)

*As compared to standard preventative care alone and as part of a pressure injury prevention protocol

SKIN INTEGRITY

Keep skin clean (avoid use of alkaline soaps and cleansers) and appropriately hydrated
(Guideline Section 3.1)

Cleanse skin promptly after episodes of incontinence
(Guideline Section 3.1)

Protect skin from moisture with a barrier product
(Guideline Section 3.1)
